



# SNOWFLAKE

*This pattern is suitable for a beginner.*



*“This sweet Snowflake motif is so versatile because it can be used on its own as a decoration to hang in a tree or you could make a blizzard of them to scatter across your windows. Why not make a few sets to use as drinks coasters to gift to friends and family - keeping a set for yourself of course. A blizzard of them can be strung together into a long garland or stitched together in formation to make a table runner or tablecloth. There’s so many ways to use this crochet motif and by changing the yarn to something sparkly or metallic or lighter in weight you can create a variety of sizes, effects and textures. This snowflake measures 14 cm”*

## **For this 14cm snowflake you will need:**

Patons Smoothie, White (or a DK cotton yarn)  
3.5mm hook

I enjoy working with Patons Smoothie because it gives a lovely texture to the project and definition to the stitches. Care does need to be taken while crocheting as the yarn does split at times but it’s easily managed.

## **UK Crochet Terms used in this pattern:**

ch = Chain  
tr = Treble  
ss = Slip Stitch  
dc = Double Crochet

**Tip:** *The snowflake is stiff enough for decoration purposes when worked in the yarn suggested, however if your work or chosen yarn is looser or softer than mine then an application of starch spray will remedy this.*



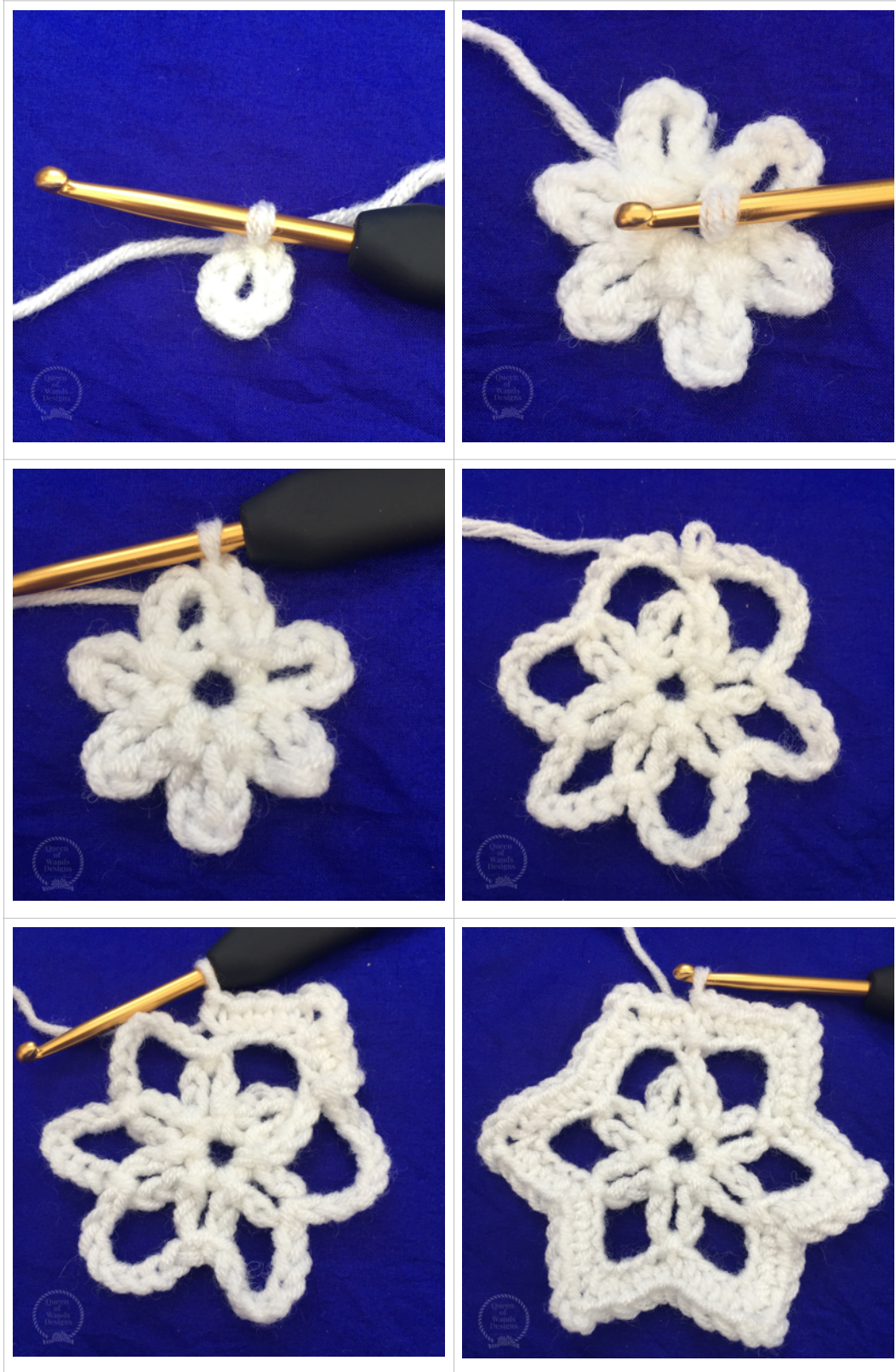
**To make the snowflake:**

1. ch6, join with ss into first ch.
2. ch6 ss into ring, repeat five times (6 loops).
3. ss into first 3 chains of first loop (midpoint of the loop), ch7 ss into top of next loop, \*ch8 ss into top of next loop\*, repeat \*to\* 3 times, ch8 ss into first ch of the ch7's at the start of the round.
4. ch2, dc into each of the first 2 chains of previous round ch3 dc into next 4 chains, \*dc into next 4 chains ch3 dc into next 4 chains\*, repeat \*to\* 4 times, ss into first ss of round to join. *You now have a star shaped motif and you could choose to stop here if you want to make some stars instead of snowflakes.*
5. ss into next 2 stitches, ss into large space (at the tip of the first point of the star shape you currently have) ch3 tr2 ch2 tr3 into same space, \*ch4 tr3 ch2 tr3 into next point space\*, repeat \*to\* 4 times, ch4 ss into third chain at start of round.
6. ss into next 2 stitches, ss into the space between the tr's, ch4 ss into same space, \*ss into next 10 stitches ss into space between the tr's ch4 ss into same space, repeat \*to\* 4 times, ss into next 7 stitches, ss into first ss of round.
7. ss into next 2 stitches, ss into loop ch5 ss into loop ch7 ss into loop ch5 ss into loop, \*ss into next 10 stitches, ss into loop ch5 ss into loop ch7 ss into loop ch5 ss into loop\*, repeat \*to\* 4 times, ss into next 10 stitches and tie off.

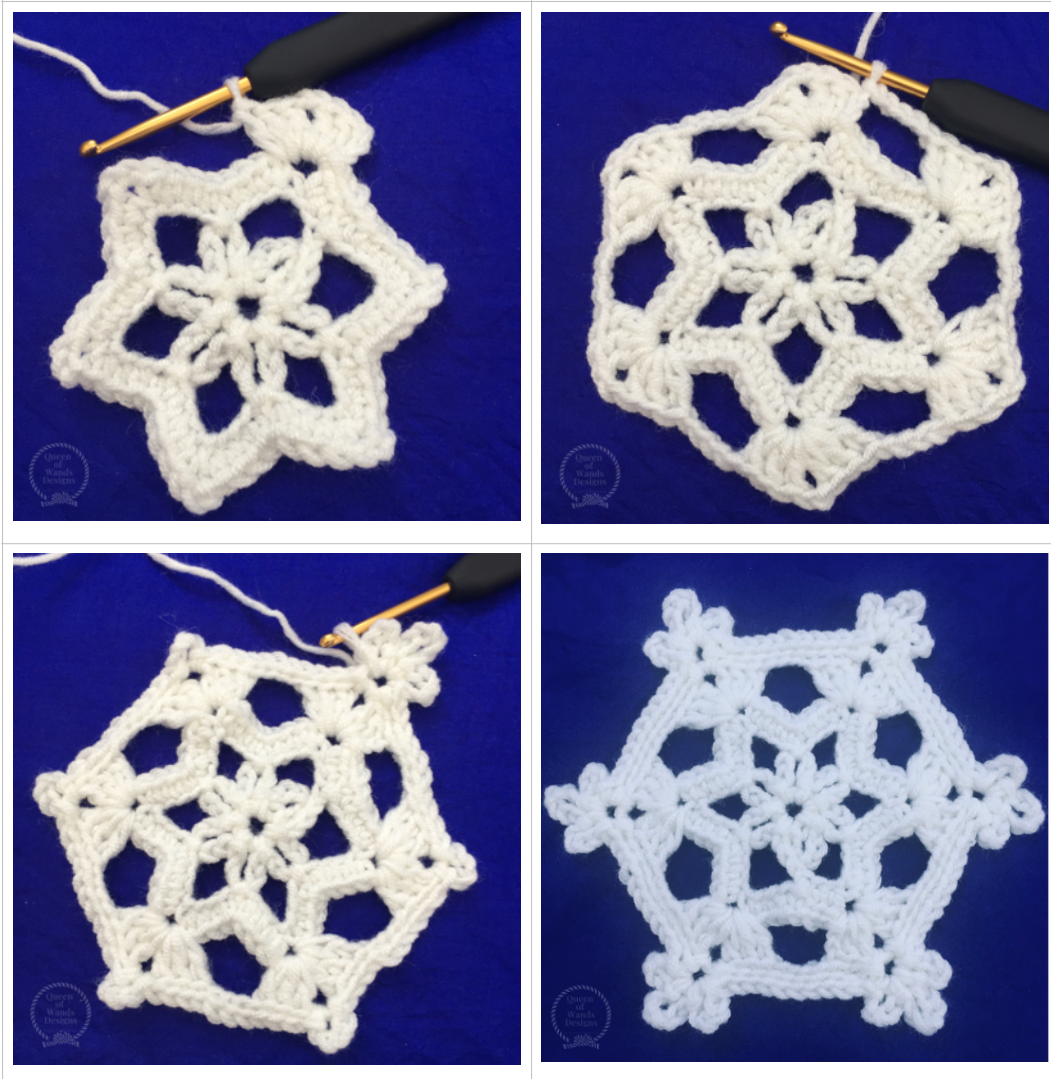
